RESOLUTION

Providing for sufficient time for legislation to be read.

1 Resolved,

2 SECTION 1. TIME FOR READING OF LEGISLATION.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—It shall not be in order for the 4 Senate to consider any bill, resolution, message, con-5 ference report, amendment between the Houses, amend-6 ment, treaty, or other measure or matter until 1 session 7 day has passed since introduction for every 20 pages in-8 cluded in the measure or matter in the usual form plus 9 1 session day for any number of remaining pages less than 10 20 in the usual form.

11 (b) POINT OF ORDER.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Any Senator may raise a
 point of order that consideration of any bill, resolu tion, message, conference report, amendment, treaty,
 or other measure or matter is not in order under
 subsection (a). A motion to table the point of order
 shall not be in order.

7 (2) WAIVER.—Paragraph (1) may be waived or 8 suspended only by an affirmative vote of three-fifths 9 of the Members, duly chosen and sworn. All motions 10 to waive under this paragraph shall be debatable col-11 lectively for not to exceed 3 hours equally divided be-12 tween the Senator raising the point of order and the 13 Senator moving to waive the point of order or their 14 designees. A motion to waive the point of order shall 15 not be amendable.

(c) CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY.—This resolution
is adopted pursuant to the power granted to each House
of Congress to determine the Rules of its Proceedings in
article I, section 5, clause 2 of the Constitution of the
United States.
