Viz:

1       On page 77, between lines 10 and 11, insert the fol-  
2       lowing:

3       SEC. 11209. (a) Notwithstanding section 1101, the  
4       levels for the following accounts in title II of division F  
5       of Public Law 118–47 shall be as follows:

6               (1) “Operating Expenses”, \$288,150,000, of  
7       which up to \$43,222,500 may remain available until  
8       September 30, 2026.

9               (2) “Capital Investment Fund”, \$44,047,000.

1           (3) “Office of Inspector General”, \$14,535,000,  
2           of which up to \$2,180,250 may remain available  
3           until September 30, 2026.

4           (b) Notwithstanding section 1101, the levels for the  
5           following accounts in title III of division F of Public Law  
6           118–47 shall be as follows:

7           (1) “Global Health Programs”, \$677,526,500.

8           (2) “Development Assistance”, \$668,270,000.

9           (3) “International Disaster Assistance”,  
10          \$812,430,000, of which \$127,500,000 is designated  
11          by Congress as being for an emergency requirement  
12          pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced  
13          Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

14          (4) “Transition Initiatives”, \$12,750,000, and  
15          up to an additional \$2,550,000 of the funds appro-  
16          priated to carry out the provisions of part I of the  
17          Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 if the Secretary of  
18          State determines that it is important to the national  
19          interest of the United States to provide transition  
20          assistance in excess of such base amount.

21          (5) “Complex Crises Fund”, \$9,350,000.

22          (6) “Economic Support Fund”, \$661,368,000,  
23          of which \$51,000,000 is designated by Congress as  
24          being for an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-

1           tion 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and  
2           Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

3           (7) “Bureau for Democracy, Human Rights,  
4           and Governance”, \$23,800,000.

5           (8) “Assistance for Europe, Eurasia, and Cen-  
6           tral Asia”, \$130,956,780, of which \$52,700,000 is  
7           designated by Congress as being for an emergency  
8           requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of  
9           the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control  
10          Act of 1985.
